Regiments A to F

The Midlothian Roll of Honour commemorates the men and women of Midlothian who gave their lives in the First World War 1914-1918.

It records details of every casualty on First World War memorials in the Midlothian area.

The document firstly contains a table listing the name, regiment and birthplace of each casualty. Below this table is the Roll of Honour (ordered by Regiment), containing greater detail (some with photographs) about each casualty.

Obituary : Thomas Anderson - Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders

[DALKEITH ADVERTISER 22 July 1915]: Private Thomas Anderson, 9th Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders, whose father, Mr James Anderson, "Maggie Bowses" (the lonely white-washed cottage which stands at the Tynehead end of Borthwick Bank on the N.B.R.), received notification from the Record Office, Perth, that he had fallen in action in France on May 10th. The gallant lad was between 20 and 30 years of age, enlisted from Cumbernauld, Dunbartonshire, where he was at the time residing with a married sister. This was about the end of December, and by February he was across the Channel taking his part in the fighting. He had previously served for about four years with the Cameron Highlanders, two years of that service being in South Africa. His father, who is an old soldier, after a long anxious wait for news of his son, was on the point of making inquiries at the regimental depot when the sad news came.



[Dalkeith Advertiser 4 November 1915]: Scout John McCabe, Lugton ... died of wounds received in action on 21st October. In a letter conveying the sad intelligence to the deceased's parents, Captain A MacArthur, A Coy, 11th Bn Argyll and Sutherland Highlander's, states that Scout McCabe got wounded in the trenches and was taken to hospital where he died from the effects of his wounds the following day ... McCabe, who was 21 years of age, was at one time employed as a gamekeeper on the Duke of Buccleuch's Dalkeith estate and was serving in a similar capacity at Cumbernauld, when, over a year ago, he enlisted into the 11th Battalion Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders, with which regiment he had been at the front about six months. The deceased, who was a crack marksman, was a prominent member of the Dalkeith Miniature Rifle Club, and as such won many prizes and recorded many excellent scores in the shooting matches. His qualifications in this direction were not overlooked by the military authorities, as on proceeding to the front he was detailed for scouting and sniping duties.



[Midlothian Journal 7 December 1917]: Mrs Andrew Dempster, Pryde's Place, has received notification that her brother-in-law, Private Alexander Mackay, Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders, was killed in action on 12 October. A comrade describing how he met his death, adds: 'He was a good and brave soldier, and died the death of a soldier.' He joined up in February 1915, and went to the front in June of that year. [DALKEITH ADVERTISER 9 January 1919]: The death took place at 3 White Hart Street, Dalkeith on Saturday, of Mr Thomas McLaren, son of Mr William McLaren, brushmaker, High Street. The deceased, in the early stages of the war, enlisted as a private in the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders. In March 1917 he was severely wounded in the fighting on the Western front, and after undergoing treatment in a military hospital was discharged as unfit for further service. For over a year past Mr McLaren was able to walk about with the aid of a staff, but his wounds left his health permanently impaired. For many years he was in the employment of Mr Forsyth, butcher. 

[Midlothian Journal 17 March 1916]: Private William Scott of the 2nd Battalion Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders has died at the base hospital in France. Private Scott, who was 44 years of age, served for seven years in the Black Watch and went through the Boer Campaign. He re-enlisted at the outbreak of the present war and has been out at the front for some time. Lieutenant Henderson, of the battalion, writing home to Mrs Scott says that Private Scott was one of the bravest men in the platoon. In one of his letters home Private Scott said that after the Battle of Loos there were very few of his comrades left, the others having all been killed or gone off sick. He was not feeling well himself and would have gone on sick leave, but by doing so he would have been looked upon as a shirker in the trenches. He died from double pneumonia. He leaves a widow and five of a family to mourn him at 6 Carnethy Street. He has a brother, Sergeant D. W. Scott serving with the same regiment at Salonika.

[The Book of Remembrance for Tweeddale: Books IV. and V: Landward Parishes]: In loving memory of Archibald J. Smith, Argyll & Sutherland Highlanders, killed in action at Neuve Chapelle, 17th March, 1915, aged 24 and a half years; Also his cousins, Company Sergeant-Major A. Doherty, 10th Highland Light Infantry, killed in action, 18th March, 1916, aged 32 years, and interred in Pleuegstreert Cemetery, Belgium; And Quartermaster Sergeant J. Doherty, reported missing, 21st March, 1918, presumed killed on that date, 2-5th. Seaforths, aged 24 and a half years. German snipers claimed Archibald Smith as a victim. News came to the burgh from a cousin of Private A. J. Smith that the latter had been shot through the head. His father received confirmation from the War Office that his son had been killed in action in France on Wednesday, the 17th March, 1915. His family went from Peebles many years ago. Prior to joining the Argyll & Sutherland Highlanders, the deceased was engaged working at the pits near Polmont, and later, was on Home Defence at Whitby in the month of September when the Germans attacked that town and its abbey. Two months before he fell, Private Smith was drafted from the 2nd to the 1st Battalion, and was ordered to the Front. He joined up at Stirling in September, 1914; went to France in February, 1915; and fell in six weeks. He was never at home. He had two brothers serving.


[MIDLOTHIAN JOURNAL 18 October 1918]: As briefly reported in our last issue, news of the serious illness of the Rev. W. J. Falside, M.A., minister of Howgate congregation, had reached Penicuik. On Saturday a letter was received giving good grounds for hope that he would yet pull through, but on Sunday afternoon a telephone message from Lockerbie conveyed the sad intelligence that a telegram had been received there by Falside's step-mother that the rev. gentleman had passed away on Sunday, the 6th inst. Mr Falside was a son of the late Rev. John Tully Falside, of Eskdalemuir, and was born at the manse of Davington. He entered Glasgow University and the Theological Hall of his own church, from both of which he emerged with distinction. He began his probationer career as assistant, first in Dundee and for a few months in connection with the Moncrieff Church, Alloa. In June, 1911, a vacancy occurred at Howgate through the Rev. J.G. Taylor transferring to Glasgow, and he was unanimously chosen as pastor of the congregation. The ordination of the young minister took place on 20th October, seven years ago, and at the soiree in the evening Mr Falside gave evidence of his earnestness to fulfil his duties as minister, and in the course of a short address he expressed the hope that he would have their forbearance so that he might be privileged to do all the good he most earnestly desired to do among them all at Howgate. Mr Falside, although of a most retiring nature, took a fair share of work in the neighbourhood, not only giving close attention to his own congregation, where he was deeply loved, but by joining in the admirable scheme of the local clergymen in exchanging pulpits at intervals, became known to and appreciated by a large and increasing number of friends in the district, who did not fail to note the earnestness of the young minister, who associated himself in other ways with the religious work in the locality. The outbreak of war brought many changes, and the call for men did not pass unheeded by Mr Falside, who received permission to join up, and in the January, 1916, he enlisted as a private in the R.A.M.C., and as a member of which he served in East and West Africa. After two years service along with other three members of the same corps he received an appointment as chaplain in His Majesty's forces, and returned to Penicuik for a brief holiday, when he again occupied the pulpit at Howgate on the first Sunday of this year. On that occasion he publicly expressed his deep sense of obligation to the Rev. R.T. Jack, whom he characterised as the "bravest, most gallant, and truest man he had ever met," who had carried on the work of the congregation in his absence. After a few months service in Ireland as chaplain Mr Falside returned to Howgate to await orders to proceed abroad. In the interval a special communion service was held on 1st September, and on the 29th of the same month he preached his last sermon to the congregation, the text being - "All things work together for good." In the course of his journey to take up his duties he contracted influenza, which developed into pneumonia, and in Italy was removed to a military hospital, where he died as stated on 6th inst. Two other brothers fell in action while serving with the K.O.S.B. The news of Mr Falside's death has called forth many expressions of regret that the youthful minister who had so endeared himself to his congregation and had gained the esteem and affection of a large circle of friends both in and out of the churches had been cut off at so early an age, and great sympathy was expressed for Mrs Falside and the other members of the family, and especially for Miss Falside, who resided with her brother at Howgate Manse. The death of the minister of Howgate is a great blow to the congregation, who are again faced with the difficulty of carrying on as a separate unit in face of the dwindling population of the landward part of the parish, which has been further aggr

[Dalkeith Advertiser 17 October 1918]: News reached Penicuik on Sunday of the death of the Rev. W. Falside in Italy on 6th inst. He was son a son of the late Rev. John T. Falside Eskdalemuir, and passed through Glasgow University with Distinction. He acted as assistant at Dundee and Alloa and in October 1911 was ordained minister of the U.F. Church, Howgate, Penicuik. In January 1916 he enlisted as a private in the R.A.M.C., and saw service in East and West Africa. In the beginning of this year he received his commission as chaplain, and as such served for eight months in Ireland. He preached in Howgate Church three weeks ago before proceeding abroad to take up duty and on the way he became ill with influenza, which developed into pneumonia. Two brothers were killed on service with the King's Own Scottish Borders.

Obituary : Walter Cunningham - Black Watch (Royal Highlanders)

[Dalkeith Advertiser 31 August 1916]: The hand of war has again fallen heavily on the pleasant eight-cottaged hamlet of Standpretty, its latest soldier son to answer the "Last Roll Call" being Pte. Walter Cunningham, Black Watch. He was a son of Mr and Mrs Jas. Cunningham, and was in his 23rd year. A miner by occupation, he enlisted in July 1915, and after a little more than three months' training was drafted out to the Western front, where he has since been in the thick of the fighting. He was for several weeks attached to the R.E., but was re-attached to his own battalion in the first week of the "great push" on the Somme. His death is reported in a letter from his chum as having taken place on 18th August. He was keen on doing his bit for King and country, and but for the state of his health he would have joined when the call to arms first rang out. In uniform he was a typical Highland soldier. Of a genial disposition and possessing many other fine qualities, he was a favourite wherever he went. Some years ago Thomas Cunningham, an older son, contracted a fatal illness while serving with the 8th Royal Scots at camp in East Lothian, and a memorial vase wreath, which marks his grave in Borthwick Churchyard, testifies to the esteem in which he was held by his comrades of the Bonnyrigg Company of the regiment. Another son, Private Adam Cunningham, is serving in the 8th Royal Scots. In civil life he was well known as head assistant to Mr Walter G. M'Nab, The Pharmacy.

Obituary : James Dalgleish - Black Watch (Royal Highlanders)

[Dalkeith Advertiser 13 May 1915]: Particulars of the death of Private James Dalgleish, of the 2nd Battalion Black Watch, have just come to hand from a letter sent by a comrade of his own. In the course of the letter, the writer says:- "When we lost James we felt rather depressed. You see, the men of the Battalion who came from India were like one big family, for being a few years in a foreign country seems to bind us together. What makes us think all the more of your brother James, was the noble spirit he showed before he passed away. While smoking a cigarette, he shook hands with us all, and when he knew it was his last, he remarked that it was 'for King and country.' Many of the men will never forget these words, for they thought it was so brave and unselfish. It was a shell that landed in our platoon, ending the lives of six and wounding a good many more. James was hit in the legs, and expired an hour afterwards. The bodies of our comrades were buried, four of them side by side, in an orchard just behind the trenches, where a service was read over by our officer. A cross will now mark the spot, for an officer of the relieving regiment promised to look over the graves and have done them up." Private Dalgleish joined the 2nd Battalion of the Black Watch seven years ago, six of which he spent in India. He came to France in the end of October, and has been through most of the fighting since. The letter above was written to his sister, Mrs Scott, who resides at 9 Second Street.



[Dalkeith Advertiser 16 May 1918]: The sad intelligence of the death of Lance Corporal David Gillies, Black Watch, reached his parents, the Rev Mr and Mrs Gillies, Ford Manse, on Saturday morning and very soon thereafter the news became known through the district and created a gloom in the village, where quite recently other homes had been plunged into sorrow by the death of sons in the great push. David was the eldest son and just before reaching the age of eighteen he joined the Black Watch. He received his earliest education in Cranstoun Public School and took the qualifying examinations at 12 years of age. The next three years was spent in Dalkeith High School, where he was successful in passing the intermediate examination admitting him to Boroughmuir High School and the Civil Service. While on duty on the 6th May a shell landed close to him, wounding him severely and leaving him, fortunately, quite unconscious. 



[The Book of Remembrance for Tweeddale: Burgh and Parish of Peebles: Book One]: Official intimation came to Peebles, in the month of December 1915, that Sergeant Walter Laidlaw, of the Royal Highlanders (Black Watch), had been missing since the 9th of May, and that he must be presumed to have fallen on that date. He was the second son of the late John Laidlaw, Biggiesknowe, Peebles, and came to France from India, where he had been stationed with his regiment for some years. A younger brother, Corporal William J. Laidlaw, who came across with the 79th Cameron Highlanders, Canadian Contingent, had a limb amputated. Another brother, Lance-Corporal Gilbert Laidlaw, residing at Newby Court, Peebles, and attached to the 1/8th Royal Scots, was invalided home from France. Other two brothers of this patriotic family were also serving their King and country John, the eldest of the brothers, acting as Sergeant-Major in the 2/8th Royal Scots; and Robert, the youngest, being a private in the 1st (Glasgow) Battalion of the Highland Light Infantry. It is a sorrowful sequel to relate that of those five gallant brothers, Corporal Robert was reported missing about the 3rd May 1917; and Sergeant-Major John, the eldest of all, fell on the 12th October 1918; in addition to Sergeant Walter, mentioned above. They were all handsome, stalwart lads, of fine physique and soldierly bearing, with much of the old Border fighting spirit among them.



[Dalkeith Advertiser 28 October 1915]: Mr And Mrs Aitken, 2 The Square, have received the melancholy intimation that their son, Private George Aitken, 5th Cameron Highlanders, British Expeditionary Force, has gallantly given his young life for the cause of freedom and justice. The following letter from Second-Lieutenant S.N. Dykes of the 5th Camerons, explains the cause of death: "Dear Mrs Aitken, I regret very much to inform you that your son was killed early this morning in an explosion in a mine. It may afford you some slight satisfaction to know that his death was absolutely instantaneous, so that he suffered no pain. He died at his post doing his duty like a soldier and a Scot. No man can hope to do more. May God comfort you in your sorrow. It is a bad time for mothers at present. If I can be of any use to you in giving details, please let me know and I shall do all in my power – Yours sincerely, G. N. Dykes, 2nd Lieutenant, 5th Camerons." A letter from the deceased soldier, received a short time ago, was to the effect that he did not think that the war would last much longer. In light vein he wrote that the Tommies were never hungry as the frights were so frequent. All things were taken as in the day's work. Prior to enlisting, Private Aitken was a miner in the employment of the Lothian Coal Coy., Ltd., and had only been a short time in France when his young life was brought suddenly to a close.



Obituary : Robert Reid Bryce - Cameron Highlanders

[DALKEITH ADVERTISER 7 October 1915]: Sergeant Robert L. Bryce, 7th Cameron Highlanders, whose father, Mr James Bryce, Bells mains, has received official intimation that his gallant son has died from a gunshot wound in the head at No.5 Stationary Hospital, Abbeville, France on 30th September. The Information to hand shows that Sergeant Bryce did his part well, and came out scathless from the great battle of the 25th and 26th September, the fatal bullet coming in one of the subsequent counter-attacks made by the enemy. Born at Bells mains 26 years ago, the keen young soldier was in civil life a tea blender, having served his apprenticeship with Messrs Law, Edinburgh, and was afterwards with Messrs Mathieson, M'Laren & Co., tea merchants, Edinburgh, up till he enlisted immediately after the outbreak of hostilities. He served for several years in one of the city's Territorial artillery batteries. An exemplary and devoted soldier, so keenly did he work to make himself efficient that when he left the Territorial Force, which he did owing to business connections, he held N.C.O. rank and several first-class certificates for efficiency in physical drill, athletics, etc., which, on his answering the "call to arms," marked him out for promotion at once. Within a fortnight after joining the Camerons he held the rank of sergeant. Numerous local lads received at his hands part of their making into good Cameron Highlanders, and have in letters home or while on furlough always mentioned him as one of the best of their sergeants. Of a generous and considerate nature, an incident that occurred at the time of his enlistment illustrates this trait in his character. He was sharing "digs" in the city with two young fellows - all three enlisted together - and previous to joining their regiments "Bert," as he was familiarly called, suggested that they continue to pay for their "digs" in case their landlady could not get other lodgers, and this the three have done out of their Army pay. He had been at the front since the end of May. Mr Bryce, sen., who for over 30 years has been a trusted employee at Catcune Mills, has received wide-spread sympathy in his loss. He has three other sons serving, i.e. - James, 9th Royal Scots, who has been in France since February; John, Lothian and Border Horse, also in France; and Alexander, who is a sergeant in the A.S.C., presently stationed in England. It is a tragic coincidence that three officers of Borthwick Parish Church have now been lost to us in the present war. First, Mr Lumsden, the organist and choirmaster, then Mr Pringle, beadle, and now Mr Bryce, who is a member of the session.

Obituary : Alexander Burnett - Cameron Highlanders

[Dalkeith Advertiser 9 December 1915]: Mr and Mrs Burnett, Charles Court, Dalkeith, have received official news of the death of their eldest son, Company Sergeant Major A Burnett, 7th Batt. Cameron Highlanders, who was previously reported wounded and a prisoner of war in a German hospital. He received four wounds in the attack on Loos on 25th September, and it is now officially reported that his death took place on 6th October, the cause of his death being a gunshot wound that affected the spinal cord. Coy Sgt Major and Second Warrant Officer A Burnett, after getting his second wound in the thigh, was advised by his Quartermaster Sergeant to retire but declined to do so, saying he would go all the way with his men. He was afterwards seen on the hill at Loos, encouraging his men by his example ... Sergeant Burnett leaves a widow and four young children. In his military career he passed through the Boer War, and was engaged in the battle of Omdurman in the last Egyptian campaign. He left the colours after the Boer war with the rank of Corporal, and re-enlisted in the 7th Battalion Cameron Highlanders early in September 1914.



[Dalkeith Advertiser 8 July 1915]: Another young Dalkeith life is this week reported to have been laid down on the battlefield in Flanders in the cause of King and country. The sad news was communicated in the following letter dated 30th June, to Mr William Cumming, 6 Amos Close, Dalkeith, by the officer commanding D Company, 2nd Cameron Highlanders: 'Dear Sir, I very much regret to tell you that your son, Corporal Cumming was killed last night about 10pm whilst engaged in constructing a communication trench behind our line. The bullet entered his head behind the ear and death was practically instantaneous. I am positive that he can have felt no pain. I have known your son intimately for the last six years and I have always considered him one of the best soldiers in the company. He is a very great loss. Please accept my very deepest sympathy.' Corporal Cumming, who was 23 years of age, enlisted into the Camerons seven years ago. On the outbreak of hostilities he was stationed with his regiment at Poona, India, and, according to the deceased, within an hour of Germany's declaration of war against Russia on the 4th August the garrison were aware of the fact. Towards the end of last year Corporal Cumming arrived in the country with the Indian Expeditionary Force and spent a few days with his father in Dalkeith, before proceeding to the front. Since landing in France he had taken part in many big encounters with the enemy. A brother of the deceased is serving at the front with the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders.

[The Book of Remembrance for Tweeddale: Burgh and Parish of Peebles: Book One]: Died on 16th November 1914, at Boulogne Hospital, France, from wounds received in action, Private George Dick, 2nd Camerons, aged 33, beloved husband of Mary Burton, Peebles, and fifth son of Robert Dick, Edston Cottages, Peebles. Private Dick, whose parents lived at Edston, enlisted in the Cameron Highlanders at the time of the Boer War, when he was 18 years of age, and served with his regiment in South Africa during part of that campaign. He was eight years in all with the Colours, being in the Reserve for the other six years. On the outbreak of war, he was called up with other Reservists, and left Invergordon for the Front on his birthday, 23rd September. Private Dick was employed in March Street Mills for some years, but had gone to work in Damdale Mill just a few weeks before the outbreak of hostilities. While in the Camerons, he won a swimming certificate at Malta, and after the inauguration of the Boy Scout movement he took considerable interest in that organisation. Private Dick was married for five years before his death, and left a widow and three young children, for whom much sympathy was felt. Two of his wife's brothers — Burtons — fell later, and also one of his own brothers — Joseph.





[Dalkeith Advertiser 14 October 1915]: We regret to have to record the death of another hero belonging to the Fushiebridge patriotic quarter-of-a-mile. This is Private James Hennessey, Cameron Highlanders, who ... had been last seen by a wounded brother lying unconscious amongst the poisonous gases used by the enemy in the great battle on 25th September. The gallant lad has now been officially reported as killed in action. The third son of Mr Andrew Clark Hennessey, Stobs Brewery, he was between twenty and thirty years of age, and previous to going out to serve King and country, which he did shortly after the outbreak of the war, he was an employee of the Arniston Coal Company. He was an amiable lad with many friends, and his death makes a blank in the roll of the East U.F. Church, of which and its associations he was a loyal attender. Wide-spread sympathy has gone out to Mr Clark Hennessey, whose household has been harder hit by the ravages of war than any other household in the Gorebridge district. Of his four soldier sons - all Camerons - Andrew was in the army when hostilities began, and served from Mons to Soissons where he was wounded, and is not yet fit for service; James has answered the last roll call; David was wounded the day his brother fell, and is now in hospital in England, while Thomas was "gassed" in the same battle, luckily, slightly. Another sore trial Mr Hennessey has had to bear since the memorable 4th of August, 1914, was the passing away of his wife. An old warrior himself, having served for many years with the Haddingtonshire Artillery Militia, he, in spite of his misfortunes, patriotically maintains that if he had as many more sons fit to serve, he would encourage them to don the King's khaki.

[Dalkeith Advertiser 16 September 1915]: Private David King, 7th Battalion Cameron Highlanders ... had been several months at the front "somewhere in France". The sad news arrived on Tuesday, an officer writing to his parents, while word was also sent by a chum, Private Thomas Thomson, to his mother at Fushiebridge. In his letter Private Thomson says: - "I have to tell you the sad news of a chum who was just as well liked here as he was at home. This is poor Davie King, who was killed yesterday (10th inst.), by a trench mortar shell, which came from those rotten Germans. He and Foley (also from Fushiebridge) were bomb throwers, and were on duty guarding a sap head with eleven other men, taking turn about at it. It was his turn off, and he had just finished his dinner and started to write a letter home when the shell landed, killing five and wounding one. Davie's death was instantaneous. He could not have had any suffering. Foley escaped and is alright. Mother, Davie died that all in the old homeland might live. A sad thing about his death that we speak about now is that he always put off writing home. He was always going to do it, and we used to say that he would die writing that letter home and, poor chap, so he did." King, who was the elder son of Mr and Mrs Thomas Chapman, Halkerston, was 23 years of age, and previous to enlisting, which he did shortly after the outbreak of war, was an underground employee of Arniston Coal Company. He was a bright and intelligent lad, well liked by his chums, and held in repute as a sprinter at local games. Two younger brothers are serving, one in the Scots Guards and one in the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders.

Obituary : Joseph Anderson McLeman - Cameronians (Scottish Rifles)

[The Book of Remembrance for Tweeddale: Burgh and Parish of Peebles: Book One]: Out of five sons, the late William M'Leman and Mrs M'Leman, Dean Park, Peebles, had three in the Army. The youngest of these, Private Joseph A. F. M'Leman, Royal Scots (attached to the Scottish Rifles), was reported missing on 5th November 1916. Later, official intimation reached Mr M'Leman that his son had been killed on the date mentioned. Private M'Leman was 21 years of age, and in June 1915 he enlisted in the 6th Royal Scots, going out to France in the first week of July 1916. Before enlisting he was employed in Tweedside Mill. He was an excellent cornet player. Of his two soldier brothers, one was with the Canadians in France, the other being in Egypt. The Corporal of Private M'Leman's platoon wrote: "Just a few lines in answer to your letter to me regarding your son Joe. He went up to the front on the morning of 5th November, at Le Transloy. It was about one o'clock in the morning. By mistake we entered the German trenches, having lost our way. We could not get our bayonets fixed, so we had to make a hand-to-hand fight to try and get out. We managed out between the lines, but the machine gun fire from the Germans compelled us to lie down. Being Corporal of Joe's platoon, I was anxious to get as many of the lads as possible out safely. Your son Joe was lying on my right, when I heard him give a shout that he was hit. Then he half raised himself up and fell on his back. I crept over to him a little closer to ask him where he had got hit, but I received no answer. Poor lad! Just shortly after, the Germans rushed us, and we had to retire and leave our wounded behind. If there had been any possible chance of us getting them in we would have done so, but the fire was too deadly. The way I knew he was your Joe, was because he was the only Joe M'Leman in our Battalion. He belonged to the Royal Scots, and was attached to the Scottish Rifles. He used to play a cornet in the Royal Scots Band. Well, Mrs M'Leman, that is all the information I can give you regarding Joe, and believe me, he was a gallant, brave young man, and a soldier to the end."







[Dalkeith Advertiser 24 June 1915]: Mr David Thomson, manager of the Peebles Cooperative Society, on Monday morning received a letter from the front stating that his youngest son, Private Lennie Thomson, 6th Scottish Rifles, had been killed in action on 15 June. A letter from a comrade of Lennie's states that he had been shot in the head while they were charging the German trenches. Private Thomson, who was eighteen years of age, was a native of Dalkeith and was educated at King's Park School. His father was well known as manager of the Cooperative Store here and left the town to fill a similar position in Peebles. His son, Lennie, joined the Territorials two years ago at Uddingston, where he was engaged as an apprentice printer with his brother.

On the outbreak of the war he volunteered for active service and proceeded to France in the beginning of the year. Since then his battalion has been almost continually in the trenches, and appears to have done much good work. On the day he met his death his Major was killed and the Lieutenant was wounded.



[The Book of Remembrance for Tweeddale: Burgh and Parish of Peebles Book Two]: William Baillie, Tweedside Mill Cottage, Peebles, was informed, through the medium of a communication from the Canadian Record Office, London, that his youngest surviving son, Sergeant James H. Baillie, Canadian Army Service Corps, had died at No. 10 Stationary Hospital, St Omer, France, on the eighth May 1918, as the result of bomb concussion during an air-raid.

Sergeant Baillie, who was 28 years of age, was born at Selkirk, and came to Peebles with his parents. He was educated at Peebles Burgh and County High School, and when he left school he entered the warehouse of Lowe, Donald & Co. He went out to Canada in 1913, and joined up at Winnipeg early in 1915, crossing the Atlantic with the second Canadian contingent. His brother, Lance-Corporal Walter Baillie, died at Peebles on the 15th January 1916, and his only surviving brother, John, joined up with him at Winnipeg, and went on service with the Canadian Veterinary Corps. The following letter was received by Sergeant Baillie's father: "I wish that the reason for my writing you were a less sorrowful one, but in these times there are not many who have not suffered the loss of someone dear to them. The Canadian Depot Unit of Supply was taken over by me about a week or so ago, and so I was just beginning to know your son at the time of the unfortunate occurrence. The three sergeants who were in charge of the different branches of the work at railhead were there with some others in the dug-out during an air raid in the early morning of 8th May, and a bomb dropped almost exactly in the entrance. You can be sure that all the precautions had been taken, and also that death was instantaneous. Your boy was buried in a pretty little country cemetery overlooking this town, near the two sergeants who had been his friends. He was a most efficient non-commissioned officer, and his loss is keenly felt in his work as well as by his comrades."



He fought under the Maple Leaf Badge, having been over two years on active service, serving with the infantry at first, but latterly, he was attached to the Tank Corps. 





[DALKEITH ADVERTISER 27 January 1916]: A wire from the War Office brought the news to Mr and Mrs Richard Bowie, Hillside, that their second son, Trooper Alexander Bowie, 5th Dragoon Guards, had killed instantaneously (shot through the head) in France on the 18th. The country's anxious call for men was answered by Trooper Bowie shortly before war broke out, and with his regiment he saw considerable active service. In all his letters home he never had a grumble, but always showed a brave, indomitable, and cheery spirit. Just 20 years of age, he, on leaving school, was apprenticed to Mr Henry McGowan, watchmaker, but after two years service he had to abandon the trade owing to a then defect in his eyesight. Apprenticed then to the butchering department of the Cooperative Store, he, at the time of his enlisting, was one of the 'Store's' most energetic employees. He is the first on the long Roll of Honour of St Paul's United Free Church to answer the 'last roll call' on the battlefield. His elder brother, Bert is a wireless operator in Royal Navy and as such has had many thrilling war experiences.

[DALKEITH ADVERTISER 21 June 1917]: Mr and Mrs Broomfield, Blackshiels Mains have just received the sad intelligence of the death of their younger son, John, who fell in action in France on the 10th instant. This gallant soldier was a corporal in the Royal Scots Greys and was most highly esteemed by every member of the regiment. He had proved himself so good a soldier that he was to receive his commission. In such high esteem was he held that his loss was universally mourned by the men, and his funeral was attended by two of the Generals and many other officers and men of various ranks. Not only as a soldier but as a man, John Broomfield was greatly admired by all who knew him and the Rev. W. M. Paterson has testified as to his rare qualities as a fighter and a friend as displayed on the field. In Fala UF Church on Sunday, the Rev. Mr Swanson made reference to this brave soldier's death and many present, who knew him well, were in tears. Mr Swanson remarked that Corporal John Broomfield was the first from the Blackshiels district to make the supreme sacrifice. It might also be mentioned that Mr and Mrs Broomfield's other son, David, is at present in Oldham Infirmary where he is making a gradual and satisfactory recovery. He received quite a number of bullet and shrapnel wounds in different parts of his body, but is now able to move about a little with the aid of sticks.



[DALKEITH ADVERTISER 14 October 1915]: The sad intelligence has just been communicated to Mr and Mrs James Scott, 166 High Street, of the death in France of their youngest son, William. The deceased, who was only eighteen years of age, was formerly employed at Smeaton Colliery, where his good nature and amiable disposition made him a favourite with his fellow workers. About a month after the declaration of war, he resolved to 'do his bit' for King and Country, and donned the uniform of the 19th Hussars, being subsequently, however, transferred to the Durham Light Infantry. He had been at the front since June. Information of their sore loss was conveyed to Mr and Mrs Scott by Lieutenant Chas E. Stewart, commanding D Company, DLI, who in his letter, dated 'In the Field' says: 'It is with deep regret that I have to inform you of the death of your son, No. 118 Private W. Scott, who was killed in action on 30 September. During the time he served under my command he performed his duties in a smart and soldier-like manner, and by his death I have lost one of my best and well-loved comrades. All officers, non-commissioned officers, and men beg to tender their heartfelt sympathy to you in this your sad bereavement. His loss is mourned by us all.' The manner in which young Scott met his death is explained in a letter from a comrade, Private A. Linton, 10th DLI, who says they were singing on the way up to the trenches, when the Germans started to shell them, and they had to run to the side of the houses for cover. A number of men, however, including William were knocked out. Private Linton enclosed with his letter a number of photographs which Private Scott had in his pocket when he met his death, and through which the fatal piece of shell had penetrated.

Obituary : James Shankie - Durham Light Infantry

[Dalkeith Advertiser 9 May 1918]: The death took place at Whalley Hospital on Sunday of Private James Shankie, signaller, Durham Light Infantry, sixth son of Mr Thos. Shankie, Craigesk Cottages, formerly of Campend. Private Shankie, who had been in France for over two years was severely wounded in action on 13th April, and brought to this country for treatment, but succumbed to his injuries. For many years in the employment of Messrs Mitchell Bros., grocers, he was well known and highly esteemed and his death will be lamented by a wide circle of friends. He was in his 39th year. A brother is serving with the Lothian and Border Horse. The funeral takes place at the family burying ground at Newton Churchyard today.

Obituary : Charles Edward Stewart - Durham Light Infantry

[Dalkeith Advertiser 19 April 1917]: The announcement is made that Captain Charles Edward Stewart, of the Durham Light Infantry, third son of Mr John George Stewart, Dunraven, Lasswade, has died at a Casualty Clearing Station of wounds received in action. Captain Stewart, who was 29 years of age, was educated at Edinburgh Academy, Brasenose College, Oxford and Edinburgh University. At Oxford he was a member of the College Eight and Fifteen and also played golf for the College. He took part in the Henley Regatta of 1908. He was a keen trout angler, and played Rugby football for Kirkcaldy for some time. His law experience was gained in the offices of Messrs Morton, Smart, MacDonald, and Prosser, W.S. and Messrs J. & J Galletly, S.S.C. He was admitted to the Society of Writers to his Majesty's Signet in 1912. He enlisted as a private in the Royal Scots in September 1914, and obtained a commission in the Durham Light Infantry in the following October. He had been at the front since August 1915. He obtained his Captaincy in September 1916, and shortly before his death has been recommended for his Majority. His youngest brother, Lieutenant Fredrick Arnold Stewart, of the Durham Light Infantry, was killed in action seven months ago. Both brothers, along with their cousin Captain Oswald Herd, enlisted together at Edinburgh Castle a few weeks after the outbreak of war, each receiving his commission in the same regiment. All three are now sleeping in soldiers' graves in France.
