# **Biographical history**

Most of the items in this collection belonged to Mr David Sharp (1900–1981) and his family.

The Sharp family had a long connection with Loanhead. David's father worked at Springfield paper mill until he was injured. He then spent a short time as a warder at Rosslynlee Hospital. He wrote newspaper articles about his work and places of interest in the local area. He established a successful business selling household china from a horse and cart. The Sharp family lived at 4 High Street, Loanhead which later was the site of Loanhead Post Office.

His son, David Sharp, was a good school student and at fourteen years old he took a job at the British Linen Bank, 95 Clerk Street, Loanhead. He later moved to the bank's head office at St Andrew Square, Edinburgh where he reached the position of head clerk. In total, he worked with the bank for over fifty years and from 1930 he lived in a flat above the Loanhead branch. This property included a large garden that extended to Hunter's Garage, something that brought David and his family great pleasure over the years. He retired in 1965 and later worked as a part-time book-keeper with Hunter's Coaches, Loanhead.

As a young boy he trained in semaphore and was conscripted into the Army in 1918. He served as a signaller in the Highland Light Infantry and in the British Army of the Rhine from March 1919. However, his military service was curtailed for family reasons. His elder brother, Alexander, a pharmacist, caught Spanish Influenza and his mother was bedridden with arthritis so David was given special dispensation to return home. Between the wars, he was a principal in productions of the Loanhead Station Ironworks Choir, where he painted scenery and helped with stage make-up. He was organist at Loanhead West Church, a loyal church elder and helped to organise a children's choir.

In 1949, he married Elizabeth (Betty) Robertson, who also worked at the British Linen Bank in St Andrew Square. The couple met while fire watching at the bank premises during the Second World War. Although an incomer to Loanhead, Betty became a stalwart member of the Women's Rural Institute and later treasurer. She helped to establish the Over Sixties Club in Loanhead and was organiser of the WRVS 'Meals on Wheels' service. In 1952, their daughter Janet Helen (Janelen) was born. She attended local schools and was a member of the Brownies and Girl Guides as well as church organisations. In 1964, she was Mistress of the Robes at Loanhead Children's Gala Day. She studied at the University of Edinburgh and

became a teacher. David died suddenly at home on 9 June 1981 and Betty on 19 February 1990. Both are buried in Loanhead Cemetery.
