82.52% said their child or young person is progressing satisfactorily

82.39% said learning an instrument has helped their child's confidence

50.35% agreed their child is more patient and disciplined since taking up an instrument.

Parents told us learning an instrument helped with:

dyslexia, problem solving, making their child feel valued and that their child was more tenacious and determined.

## **YOUNG PEOPLE** (111 respondents):

71.82% of you agree or strongly agree the lessons are challenging.

86.36% agreed or strongly agreed the lessons are fun.

90.83% agreed or strongly agreed the lessons are useful.

**69.44%** said the length of lessons could be improved.

## HERE'S WHAT WE PLAN TO DO IN 2020:

- Recruitment campaign to encourage more young people to take music tuition
- Explore new ways of giving parents online feedback on their child or young person's progress
- Ensure lessons are 25 minutes long and look at potential to lengthen them
- Give parents digital tools (such as apps) to help pupils progress and keep motivated to practise.
- Produce annual report
- Satisfaction survey (yearly or every second year)
- Work closely with new Music Working Together Group who are pursing charitable status.
