NOTICE OF MAKING OF TREE PRESERVATION ORDER LAND NORTH OF OLD GOLF HOUSE

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that **MIDLOTHIAN COUNCIL** has made a Tree Preservation Order in respect of the trees contained within the area detailed in the plan and described in the First Schedule to the Order which accompanies this Notice.

The Council's reasons for making the Order are that the trees are of value and suitable for protection through a Tree Preservation Order for the following reasons:

- For their contribution to the character, amenity and landscape setting of Newbattle Abbey including listed buildings and the associated landscape which is included on the Inventory of Gardens and Designed Landscapes.
- For their contribution to the character and amenity of the Newbattle Conservation area.
- For their contribution to the character and amenity of the River South Esk riparian woodland corridor, which is important for its biodiversity value and as a green network connection.
- For their role providing separation between older buildings on the bank of the River South Esk including Old Golf House and the newer residential properties on Newbattle Abbey Crescent.
