NOTES

1. A licence may be granted to an individual over the age of eighteen years, or a body corporate.

It will be a condition of any licence granted that the carrying on of the business of a riding establishment at no time shall be left in the charge of any person under 16 years of age.

- 2. It will be a condition of any licence granted that no horse will be let out on hire for riding or used for providing instruction in riding without supervision by a responsible person of the age of 16 years or over unless (in the case of a horse let out for hire for riding), the holder of the Licence is satisfied that the hirer of the horse is competent to ride without supervision.
- 3. (i) "Horse" includes any mare, gelding, pony, colt filly or stallion, and also any ass, male or jennet.
 - (ii) The Act regulates riding establishments which let our horses on hire or use them for the purpose of providing, in return for payment, instruction in riding or for the purpose of demonstrating riding.
- 4. A Licence is valid from the date of issue or from the First day of January next. Please state preference.

How your personal Information is used by Midlothian Council Protective Services including Environmental Health

Under the Data Protection Act 2018, you have a right to know how we collect, use and share your personal data. The Environmental Health function carries out a wide range of regulatory functions for Midlothian Council. In doing so we collect information about individuals and businesses. We enforce the laws in areas such as private sector housing, food safety, workplace safety and environmental crime. We also issue various licences including Animal Welfare Licences. This privacy notice explains the information Environmental Health needs in order to carry out these functions.

Environmental Health is part of the Place Directorate Midlothian Council. More information about privacy notices can be found on the Councils website

Our Privacy Promise We promise to collect, process, store and share your data safely and securely.

What lets us collect your information?

Environmental Health processes your personal information in accordance with the following data processing conditions:-

- Where processing is necessary for the exercise of official authority or for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest
- Where processing is required by law

The main laws under which Environmental Health can process your information in relation to animal health and welfare licences are listed below.

Animal Health and Welfare (Scotland) Act 2006 The Animal Welfare (Licensing of Activities Involving Animals) (Scotland) Regulations 2021 Animal Boarding Establishments 1963 Riding Establishments Act 1964 and Riding Establishments Act 1970 Dangerous Wild Animals Act 1963 Zoo Licensing Act 1981

What kinds of personal data do we collect?

The personal data we collect might include your **name**, **date of birth**, **address**, **National Insurance number**, **or other information that identifies you**. If necessary, we might also collect what is called 'special category' data – that is, sensitive information such as your gender and medical/health information.

How do we collect your personal data?

We collect your personal data in many different ways. You might give us your personal data yourself, by entering your information in an application form, a contact form on the Council website or by contacting a Council officer in person, in writing or over the phone. We might also receive your personal data from other council services, other agencies or local authorities.

How do we use your personal data?

The personal data collected from you may be used in different circumstances:-

- For the purposes of performing any of our statutory enforcement duties
- to contact you about a complaint, service request or application you have made to us
- to maintain any registers that the law requires us to keep
- If you have applied for a licence of some sort we may use your personal data to check that

you have not been disqualified from holding a licence, committed certain offences relating to fraud, violence or drugs, or contravened any laws, rules or agreements that may stop you being issued with a licence

- to determine if you are a fit and proper person in accordance with the Act or associated Regulation.
- for the collection of any fees due to the Council

Do we share your personal data?

We will only share your personal data if it is necessary to do so and the appropriate conditions have been met to protect it. We will share your personal data if we are compelled to share it by law. If we share information regularly with another organisation, the conditions for sharing your personal data are set out in an Information Sharing Agreement or are permitted by legislation.

With whom do we share your personal data?

Your Personal data may be shared with other Midlothian Council services where we are carrying out a regulatory function or where it is necessary for us to carry out a service you have asked us to. We may share your personal data with other persons authorised by Midlothian Council to act on our behalf in carrying out the requirements of the above legislation such as contractors If necessary, we might share your personal data with other agencies and authorities, depending on the service being provided.

How long do we keep your personal data?
