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Development Plan Scheme 18 Consultative Draft

What is a Development Plan Scheme?

1. This is the **consultative draft** Development Plan Scheme Number 18 (DPS18) for Midlothian. The DPS sets out Midlothian Council's programme for preparing the next Midlothian Local Development Plan (MLDP2) to replace the current Midlothian Local Development Plan adopted in 2017. The DPS also includes a Participation Statement which outlines future engagement on MLDP2.
2. As required by legislation, Midlothian Council is seeking views on the Participation Statement but is also interested in any comments on the timetable for MLDP2. See the 'HAVE YOUR SAY' section on page 9 for further information on how to get involved. Midlothian Council will review comments received, consider these in preparing a final DPS and after approval by the Council will issue DPS18. **Comments on this DPS18 should be submitted to the Council by the end of 31 May 2026.**

What is the Midlothian Development Plan?

3. The approved development plan for Midlothian is the [\(NPF4\) National Planning Framework 4 - gov.scot](#) and the [Midlothian Local Development Plan 2017 \(MLDP 2017\)](#). Copies of MLDP 2017 can also be viewed at any Midlothian Library. Development plans allocate land for development, contain policies for assessing applications for planning permission and guide the future development of an area.
4. Approved Supplementary Guidance currently forms part of the Local Development Plan and is available to view [here](#). Midlothian Council will not bring forward further Supplementary Guidance to help inform implementation of MLDP 2017. The Council has reviewed the existing approved guidance, and it will where relevant and necessary be reflected in MLDP2.

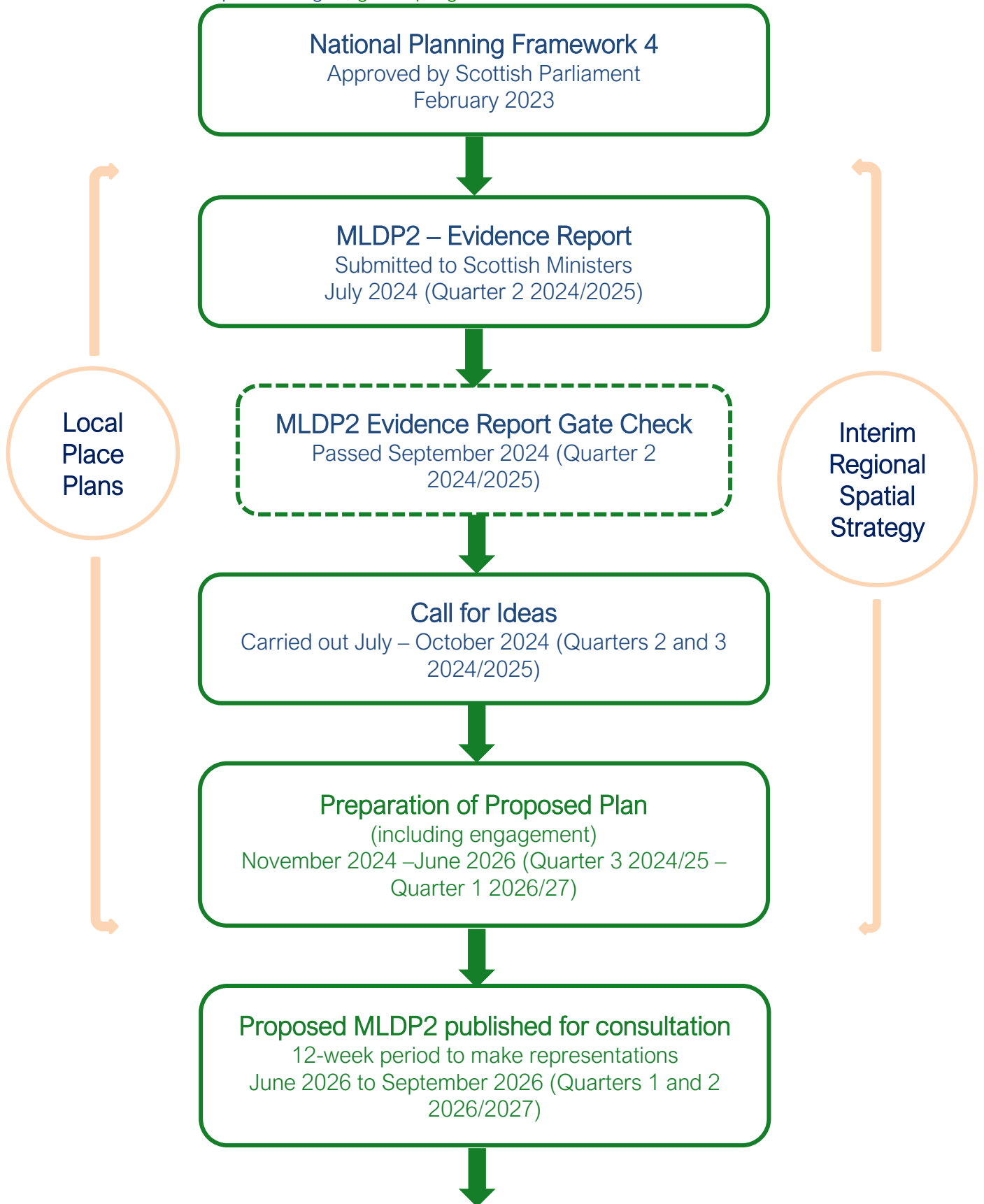
Changes in Timetable Since DPS17

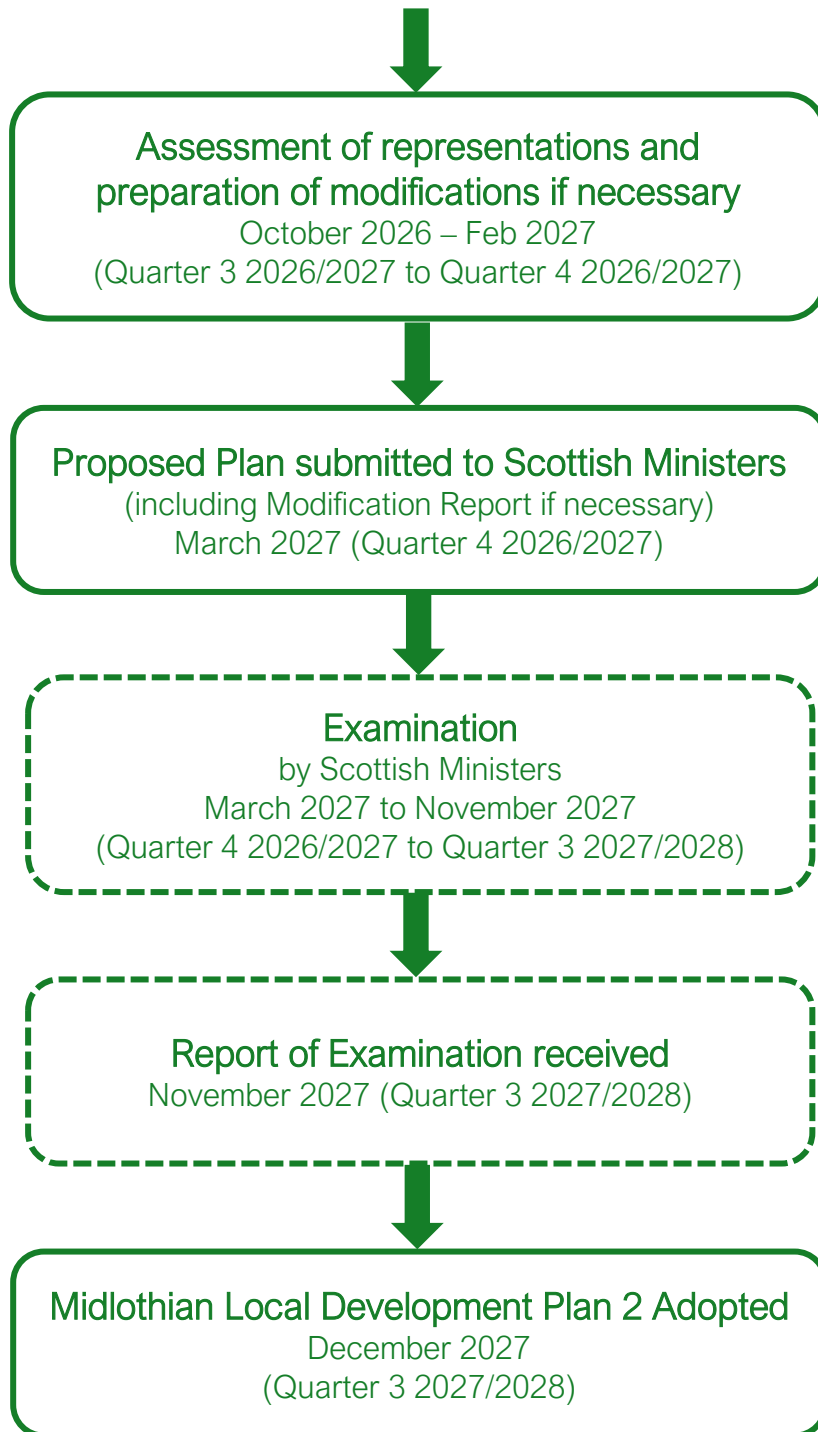
5. The publication date for the MLDP2 Proposed Plan for public consultation is now hoped to be in June 2026, as opposed to November 2025 identified in DPS17. This has been done to allow for the infrastructure requirements of the plan explored, including the results of a Transport Assessment of the Plan. These requirements will be reflected in the Delivery Programme, to be published alongside MLDP2. This causes the submission of the Proposed Plan (and modification report, if required) to Scottish Ministers for Examination to be programmed for March 2027. This timescale for submission of the Proposed Plan to Scottish Ministers for Examination has been partially set to help provide for additional time to consider consultation responses on the Proposed Plan. If no (or only very limited) modifications are required, it may be possible to accelerate this part of the timetable for submission of the Proposed Plan to Scottish Ministers for Examination. The programme results in the adoption of MLDP2 by December 2027, but this will be contingent on how long the Scottish Government takes to examine the plan.

What is involved at each stage of plan preparation?

6. Proposed Plan Preparation: The Proposed Plan includes a development strategy, planning policies, and allocations of land for development. It differs in content and style from the adopted MLDP 2017. Reforms to the statutory planning system mean that MLDP2 should not replicate policies in NPF4 (which now forms part of the Development Plan), instead being more focussed on local circumstances. Supplementary Guidance which forms part of the development plan can no longer be produced. Therefore, decisions will be required on what goes in MLDP2 itself, and what might go into planning guidance, which has a lesser status, and does not form part of the development plan.
7. To prepare the Proposed Plan, information from the Evidence Report, Local Place Plans and the Call for Ideas and Opportunities has been used alongside engagement with stakeholders. The Council has also commissioned evidence in respect of retail planning, landscape sensitivity for renewable energy development and a transport appraisal. Studies of the Green Belt and the Newbattle Strategic Greenspace Safeguard have been undertaken, and the Special Landscape Area Statements of Importance reviewed. There has been engagement on topics where more clarity was required, reflecting commitments made at Evidence Report stage, or requests from the Evidence Report Gate Check Notification of Sufficiency.
8. Proposed Plan Publication: Approval will be sought from the full Council to publish the Proposed Plan and to commence a 12-week public consultation period to lodge representations. This is shown in the timetable of this DPS. The Council will undertake wide publicity for this publication as well as notifying persons who have indicated an interest in MLDP2. Regulations also require the Council to notify the owners, lessees and occupiers of sites where development is proposed, and the owners, lessees and occupiers of land neighbouring of such sites. Neighbouring land means land which is “conterminous with or within 20 metres of the boundary of a specific site”.
9. Potential Modification of Proposed Plan: On consideration of representations, the Council may decide that there is a case for modifying the Proposed Plan. In this case a Modification Report will be prepared setting out modifications made and the reasons for making them. This Modification Report must be agreed by full Council before submission of the Proposed Plan to Scottish Ministers.
10. Submission of Proposed Plan to Scottish Ministers: Where there are representations that are not resolved, the Council will request that the Ministers appoint a person to examine the Proposed Plan and these unresolved representations.
11. Examination: The Examination is the opportunity for independent consideration, by a Scottish Government appointed Planning and Environmental Appeals Division Reporter, of any issues raised during the formal consultation on the Proposed Plan that have not been resolved through modifications. As well as considering the contents of the Proposed Plan, the Reporter will consider whether the requirements of the Participation Statement have been met.
12. Adoption of MLDP2: On receiving the Examination Report, the planning authority must make modifications to the Proposed Plan as recommended by the Scottish Government Reporter. There are limited grounds for declining to make a modification. The plan will be adopted through report to a full Council meeting.



What has happened with MLDP2 over the last year?

13. The Proposed Plan is being prepared. It includes policies, a spatial strategy and allocations. Alongside the Plan a Delivery Programme which sets out how the plan will be implemented has been prepared. A number of different assessments have been undertaken to support the preparation of MLDP2. These are:
 - Strategic Environmental Assessment.
 - Habitats Regulations Appraisal.
 - Integrated Impact Assessment (combines requirements in respect of Equalities Impact Assessment, Public Sector Equality Duty Assessment and Fairer Scotland Duty Assessment).
14. The Planning Service has reviewed the submissions to the Call for Ideas and Opportunities, which including potential sites for development. These have been assessed using the site assessment methodology. Workshops have been held with elected members to help select the new sites to meet Midlothian's housing land requirements and other needs such as land for employment. Work has also been carried out on policies for MLDP2. The new policies reflect the role of NPF4, which forms part of the Development Plan, and consider local needs and results of monitoring of the adopted plan.
15. The Planning Service has liaised closely with infrastructure and service providers to understand the implications of the plan, and the necessary interventions to make it work. External consultancy was commissioned in the form of a Transport Appraisal and Retail impact assessment. An 'in-house' assessment of the Green Belt has been carried out.
16. Midlothian Council has maintained a list of individuals seeking self-build housing. This is housing where a person commissions or is personally involved in the design and construction of a dwelling that is intended to be the individual's main residence. Local Place Plans

17. Local Place Plans are community-led plans setting out proposals for the development and use of land. Once completed and then registered by the planning authority, they are to be taken into account in the preparation of the relevant local development plan. In June 2024 Midlothian Council registered eight LPPs. They are all from Midlothian community councils and are listed below:
 - Bonnyrigg and District Community Council
 - Damhead and District Community Council
 - Eskbank and Newbattle Community Council
 - Gorebridge Community Council
 - Mayfield and Easthouses Community Council
 - Newtongrange Community Council
 - Rosewell and District Community Council
 - Roslin and Bilston Community Council
18. The LPPs have been taken into account when preparing the LDP. Two further draft LPPs were received (from Penicuik and District and Loanhead and District Community Councils). In addition, Tynewater and Moorfoot Community Councils carried out community engagement on the matter.



The Council sought to ensure that communities that do not have an LPP were fully engaged in the process.

Participation Statement

19. A Participation Statement sets out how, when and with whom the Council will consult and engage on when preparing its local development plan. Prior to adoption of MLDP2, at the Examination stage of plan production, Reporters from the Scottish Government's DPEA (Planning and Environmental Appeals Division), appointed by Scottish Ministers, will review the Council's engagement activities to see that they match what the Council said it would do in the Participation Statement.
20. Engagement is at its most effective at the early stages of plan preparation – and has been extensive at the earlier, formative stages of the plan. Within the framework of the new planning system, the Council sought to maintain open channels of communication so that a wide range of ideas on policy could be exchanged in advance of publication of the Proposed Plan. Interested parties are and will continue to be encouraged to register an interest with the Council so they can be updated as the plan is developed.
21. The next steps of MLDP2 preparation and how engagement will occur are listed below and further details are provided in Table 1:
 - Publication of the Proposed Plan, draft Delivery Programme and draft Environmental Report.
 - Modification of Proposed Plan (if required).
 - Examination into unresolved objections (if required); and
 - Adoption of MLDP2 by Midlothian Council.
